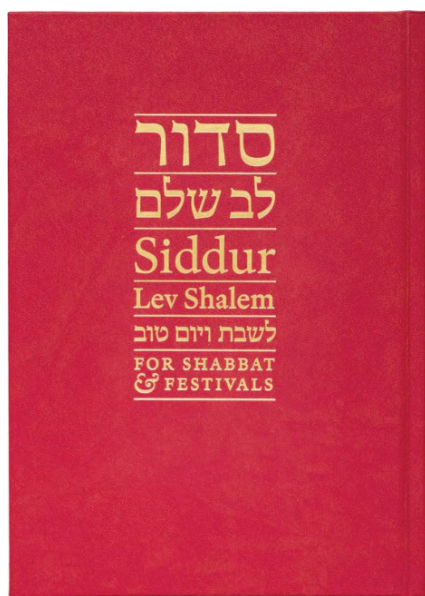
Congregation Beth Shalom Welcomes New Siddurim

On Shabbat morning, March 21, we will be dedicating new siddurim in our sanctuary. We will be dedicating new copies of Siddur Lev Shalem which is Conservative Judaism's most recent siddur (prayer book). This is made possible through the generosity of an anonymous family in memory of all those lost in Israel's October 7th attack, and the Eisemann Family Fund in memory of Dr. Gustave & Elinor Eisemann.

Ohev Sholom brought a number of the Lev Shalem siddurim during our consolidation. We have them in our sanctuary and call the pages in the "Red Book."

Lev Shalem will offer a number of new elements that we don't currently have in the Sim Shalom that we have been using for decades. The first is a beautiful, contemporary design that is easy to read and attractive. Additionally, the English translation has a natural and inclusive feel as you read it. What I love about Lev Shalem the most are the commentaries and additional readings. The commentaries are written by many Conservative Rabbis from different generations. They call upon ancient texts and modern interpretations. Also, there are additional poems, readings, and lifecy-



cles for sustained relevancy. The addition of much more transliteration (Hebrew prayers written in English characters) will increase accessibility in our services.

The relationship one has with a siddur is immensely intimate. It is different than either a novel or non-fiction book. It is not a reference book. A siddur is meant to simultaneously root you in the prayers of our people and inspire each of us to tap into the authentic inner praying voice inside. During our shared Shabbat time together, Lev Shalem will give you the ability to be in a more meditative, contemplative and curious space because of its additional resources.

While we have donors for the bulk of our new siddurim, individuals and/or families are able to dedicate individual siddurim themselves. Each siddur dedication is \$72. Visit BethShalomKC.org to fill out a dedication page.

I look forward to learning to use this prayer book with you, as it will be new for me, Rabbi Kaplan and Hazzan Ben-Yehuda. We all look forward to celebrating milestones together and also using it together to find comfort when we need that as well.

Time to Catch Our Breath

Say that Passover is coming soon, and you can often sense people's breaths growing shorter and quicker. Ironically, it is a similar shortness of breath that the Torah uses to describe the enslaved Hebrews in Egypt. Of course, preparing for Pesach is stressful — there is simply a lot to do. But it's worth pausing to ask: are we preparing for a holiday commemorating our liberation from Egypt and service to God, or are we piling unnecessary distress onto ourselves? Reflecting on how we relate to Passover preparations can make a difference in the headspace in which we enter the holiday.

For example, many people find deep cleaning the kitchen itself to be a form of spiritual preparation. Whether it's the time for quiet reflection on the themes of the holiday while doing chores, or taking stock of where our inner spiritual life is as we work through pantries and drawers, the physical work and the inner work happen together. It's beautiful. For me, though, deep cleaning is genuinely challenging, and so I now get help. Like many things, deep cleaning our kitchen is not inherently positive or negative. If it works for you, lean into that. If you find it creates more obstacles, find other ways to prepare your-

self for the priorities of the holiday.

Here's the thing. What we are actually commanded to do at Passover is as follows: remove leaven from our homes before the holiday begins, eat matzah on the first night, and tell the story of the Exodus on the first night. We are commanded to refrain from eating, seeing (our own), finding (our own), or benefitting from hametz.

Yes, we need to get our homes ready and shop for groceries. However, preparing to do these mitzvot is the essential task in the weeks leading up to Passover. When we notice our breath shortening, perhaps we can pause and ask: what is all of this in service of? That question won't make the stress disappear. But it might help us approach the logistics with a little more intention — and in doing so, open something in us spiritually.

This year, may the barriers between us and liberation come down easily, with just a little mindfulness and a lot of self compassion. May the taste of matzah be followed by the redemption we so desperately seek. Chag Kasher v'Sameach.

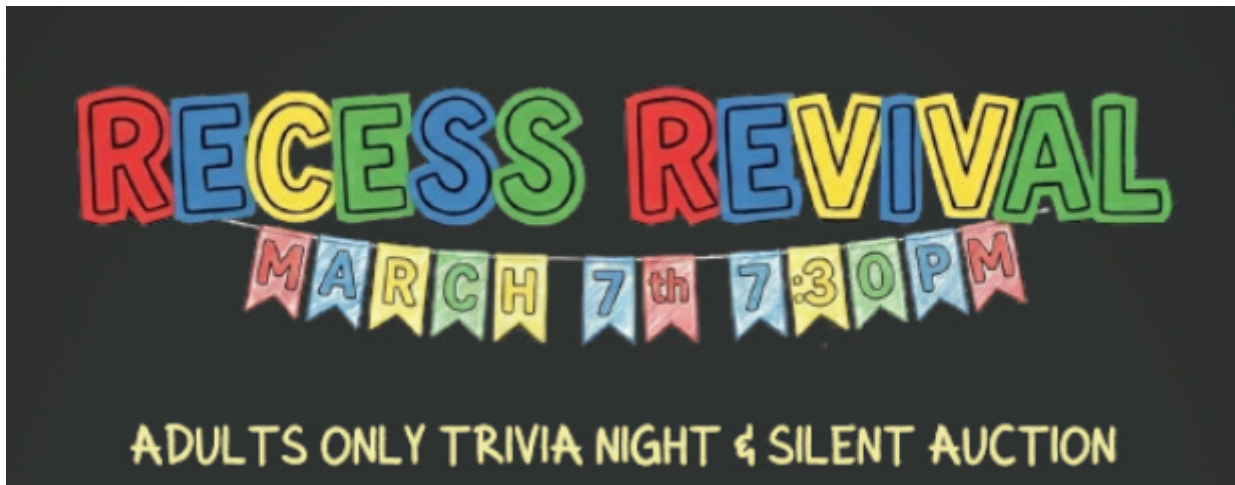
